



2018 Roadway Program – Johnson Avenue (47th to Burlington) and Lawn Avenue (Burlington to Elm)

Why these streets?

Every year, staff completes a roadway inspection survey for the entire Village. The results of the survey as well as the condition of the water main and sewer help to determine which roads need maintenance. For more information on the roadway inspection survey, please visit www.wsprings.com/roads and view the 2017 Modified Pavement Condition Index (MPCI) report.

How can I stay updated?

The Village website will provide you with all of the information that you need during the project. Updates will be posted at least once a week and before any type of water shut off or other inconvenience. To sign up for e-mail updates, visit www.wsprings.com/roads and follow the “Notify Me” instructions. Staff will also be available to speak on the phone, through e-mails, or meet in person with any resident during the course of the project.

When will construction begin?

Construction is estimated to begin after July 4, 2018. Staff will have an official start date once the contract bids are opened and awarded. The official start date will be posted on the Village website.

How does this effect you?

A concrete reconstruction project is both complicated and intrusive. The following list outlines the major impacts the projects will have on residents:

- Driveway access will be unavailable for 3-4 weeks for each side of the street.
- All driveway aprons will be removed and replaced with concrete to meet specifications in Village Code 8-2-8 unless asphalt is requested, in writing, to the Village. New aprons will meet the width of the existing driveway at the sidewalk and taper 3' on both sides at the curb line where possible. Brick driveway aprons and walkways that reside in the parkway will be removed and bricks will be stacked on the private property of the resident until they are reset at the close of the project. If any residents wishes to have a concrete walk instead of brick, please notify the Village. (Village Code 8-2-8)
- One lane of traffic will remain available after work is completed for the day. This lane will always be one-way, southbound only.
- Residents are required to mark private sprinkler systems in the parkway prior to the start of construction. Marking includes placing stakes or flags at sprinkler heads and locations of piping in the parkway and within 3 feet of the house side of the public sidewalk. If the sprinkler system is not marked, no attempt can be made to minimize damage to the system and the Village will not pay for repairs.
- Expect increased construction traffic and noise for the duration of the project. Please be mindful of vehicles, workers, and roadway conditions when entering and leaving the construction area.
- Overnight parking will be available on surrounding side streets while driveway access is unavailable.
