

Central Avenue Roadway and Sewer Improvements:

- The Village is preparing an engineering study for the Central Avenue Roadway and Sewer Improvements project. A [public meeting](#) will be held this evening, September 15, at the Upper Pavilion of Spring Rock Park. Residents may drop in any time from 5 – 7 pm to ask questions and learn more. Roadway Construction:

- The Municipal Services Department oversees the Village's [Roadway Construction Program](#), and provides regular updates on current projects (such as those on Prospect and Clausen Avenues). Residents can register to receive these updates directly via text or email by following instructions on the website. The 47th Street resurfacing project that begins this week is an IDOT project, but details will be shared on the Village website as they become available.

Plainfield Road Corridor Study:

- The Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways (DOTH) has initiated a Plainfield Road Corridor Phase I Study, with the objective of addressing the existing roadway and drainage deficiencies, enhancing the bicycle/pedestrian accommodations, and improving safety and mobility for all users. Community participation is critical to the study and developing improvements. Please take a few moments to complete an interactive survey that seeks input from Cook County residents.
